or many years, Ann has found herself in and out of shelters. She remembers a time when life seemed to be heading in a positive direction and things seemed to be happening for her good. She was able to secure a house of her own, live independently with her children, and even had an opportunity that took her to Florida for 9 years. Life was good...or so she thought.

In 2010, after a series of events took a toll on her life, Ann felt called to return to Michigan and moved in with daughter. So she packed up her life in Florida and returned. It wasn't long after that when Ann was able to get an apartment on her own and return to independent living.

However, Ann never really felt settled. She constantly had a yearning to be a part of the city, a big city. So once again, Ann found herself moving to New York City. Bright lights, fast paced living... she was sure that this was where she was supposed to be and that the right doors had finally opened.

For three years she was living her dream.

But being away from her children was constant challenge for Ann. When she found out that her daughter was dealing with some relationship issues, Ann made the decision to leave the big city and return to Muskegon to help her daughter through this difficult time in her life.

After life returned to normal for Ann and her family, it didn't take long before she, once again, found herself desiring to be a part of the big city. This time, Chicago. With no place to stay or a job in line, Ann took up residence in a shelter for two months to pursue her city desires. Ann noticed that her attitude was not great and that the big city was leaving her void and empty. "I just knew that God was calling me back home...here, Muskegon" said Ann.

So just like the other times before, she moved back in with her daughter. A place that quickly became a negative situation for the entire family. "I just knew that we had to leave and I couldn't leave my

daughter in the situation either" said Ann. That's when they both came to Muskegon Rescue Mission. A familiar place, as Ann knew from being here when her children were small. "I knew we would be safe and welcomed here" Ann said.

After one month, Ann watched her daughter transition out of the mission into a place of her own. But Ann chose to stay. "I could have left here a long time ago" she says, "but the chapel speakers and the services that are offered kept me here." God was working in Ann's life and she was willing to let it happen.

"God needed me to be still...
be patient because he was working
his plan...for my good" said Ann. "
For so long, I had tried to do things,
in every which way on my own...
and they weren't working." There
was never a fulfillment in her life
until she put Christ as her guide.
"I listened to so many people and
myself that I was drowning out
what God was trying to say to me
through it all" Ann says. In fact, her
own father told her it was a mistake
to come here, but she knew God

was calling her here and that's who she followed.

"There are things that will always stand out from my stay here at the mission, structure and stability" say Ann, "I needed that. I wouldn't always admit that, but I needed it. Curfew, wake up, classes, etc." They all prepared her for the next step and phase. Ann admits "I hated it while I was a guest at the mission, but it has structure my life for independent living." Even the money management classes, "I didn't come here for that, but it truly has helped me" she states.

Ann never liked going to chapel, "in fact it was probably safe to say that I hated it, but the message always seemed to be directed to me" Ann explained. "God was speaking to me, working on my heart and mind. I always felt like they were speaking straight to me."

There was one chapel speaker that had a major impact on me, Pastor Randall. I remember his message one day saying "there are never mistakes in

life...our choices are learning steps, they all happen for a reason and have purpose." Ann left that chapel session forever changed.

Pastor Randall shared an illustration that day that Ann uses as a constant reminder that God is in control and that he has a plan always. Pastor Randall explained our lives as a "weaving project." When you look at life from the top side, you see a beautiful, lovely picture. But when you flip the



tapestry over...you see strings, snarls, and a tangled mess. And that's the side that we tend to see and focus on, the mess. But when we begin to see life how God intends for us to see it, we see a beautiful picture in the end.

"If it wasn't for the mission welcoming me with open arms, time and time again, I don't know where I would have ended up" says Ann. "The services and programs here helped me to see that I need to live for Him (Jesus Christ) and not my crazy desires." Ann explained. My life verse is now "Jeremiah 29:11 For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."" Ann says "My mind and my desires were calling me to big cities, but God was working in my heart and calling me home...both to family and to Him!" Ann is now living independently in an apartment of her own, has a job, and enjoys spending time with her family.


Graduation Day for Men from the New Life Program

In the April issue of Harbor Light, you met Mike. He had come to Muskegon Rescue Mission after a series of unfortunate events took place in his life. Mike knew he needed help, guidance and direction and he knew he couldn't do it on his own.

Two other men, Scott and Will found themselves in similar, yet, different situations. Shortly after arriving these men entered our New Life Program. Our New Life Program focuses on rebuilding lives with a solid biblical foundation, offering lifelong solutions. All aspects of a program participants lives are addressed – physical, mental, spiritual, emotional and social. They participate in Bible study and money management classes

and receive spiritual and life skill counseling. Job training, as well as, job search assistance is provided. Everyone also actively attends a church in the community.

We are happy to announce that within the last few months, all three men have graduated from the program. A graduation ceremony was held and the men had an opportunity to celebrate with family, friends, and staff.

"It's a very exciting and emotional time," says Brian Plumhoff, New Life Program Manager. "To know and see where these men have come from, and to see the difference that Christ has made in their lives – to see the old desires gone – and life being lived for Him (Christ) is a very powerful testimony."

At their graduation ceremony, the men have a chance to share their testimonies. This is a public declaration in front of family and friends, as the men acknowledge how far they have come and the fact that they could not have done it on their own, but through the power of Christ within them.

Now that the three men have successfully completed the New Life Program, they will transition into our After-Care Program where we will continue to mentor them as they transition to independent living. All three men have jobs working in the community, and are plugged in and growing with church communities.

Praise God for the work done in the lives of these men. The stories of these men are beautiful examples of the lasting change that is made possible through the help of faithful friends like you. These men have expressed their gratitude for the generous gifts that donors provide to help make programs and this ministry possible!
